Welcome to Eagle Mine. In order to make your visit a safe one, please familiarize yourself with the following basic requirements. If you have any questions about these requirements or other specific safety conditions see your Eagle Mine representative or contact site security or HSE.

1. Emergency & Incident Notification

- Report all unsafe work practices, unsafe work conditions, injuries or incidents to your contact.

- If unable to reach security or HSE, Call 911

2. Personal Protection

- At a minimum a hard hat, safety glasses w/side shields, steel or composite toed boots, gloves, and high visibility vests or clothing, (minimum Class 2) must be worn at all times while working at the Mine and Mill sites or any active work area.
- Additional safety equipment may be required based on the work being performed and/or exposure to unique hazards.
- Finger rings and watches with conductive watch bands must be removed when in plant operating areas.
- Stay in your designated visit or work area. Access to "authorized" or "restricted" areas is prohibited unless accompanied by an Eagle Mine representative.
- Obey posted warning and safety signs.
- Eat and smoke only in designated areas.

3. Hazard Recognition

- Before beginning work, discuss all aspects of your job with the Eagle Mine employee designated as responsible for the job.
- Remember to conduct a pre-task hazard assessment before starting each job or task.
- Always be alert for potentially hazardous conditions.
- Be on the lookout for mobile equipment – Mobile equipment has the right of way when on site or in an active work area.
- A variety of potentially hazardous chemicals may be present across the site. Review SDS and Hazard Labels for safety information. Be alert for warning signs/alarms.
- If you are in doubt of any procedure or hazard, discuss it with
- Emergency exits and assembly points
- Emergency equipment locations (first aid kits, fire extinguishers, AED, etc.)
- Communication systems explained
- Emergency Response Plan explained
